Now that the snow has left, at least for a little while, I am seeing the effects of a cold winter on the plants outside. The barren trees and brown grass can have a saddening effect on our spirit. Yet we have confidence that the Spring will bring the hope of new life that will cause the dormancy to fade and new life to burst out in living color. The transformation will be a welcome sight to both the spirit and the mind as we shake off the Winter blues. Yet what if the change does not come? What if, instead of dormant, the plants are dead? It is difficult to tell on some plants until we reach the fullness of Spring.

Driving around the area I have seen some interesting things. Some land owners have made the Spring renewal a little easier for the grasses and wild flowers by burning off the ditches and waterways so the dead is gone, purged by fire. From what was seen in the past, this proves to be very helpful as the dead stalks would block the sunlight on the new growth. The dead stalks also make for some unsightly views of the new, living plants as they try to push up into the sunlight. The purge brings out a lush and lovely green scene of life after the ashes. Preparing for the return of producing fruit in praise and honor of the Creator is always good work.

With the return of the Spring season, I am wondering if there may be a lesson in all this activity for us? Are we ready to clean out the old, dead, and decaying parts of ourselves so that we can bloom in the glorious Son-light of God's love? If we were to look in the mirror, will we see the dregs of the past tarnishing our ability to honor God with the vitality and beauty of the new life we have been given? While it is often difficult for us to lay aside our past, God has called each of us to be clothed with His glory so that we can be the light to the world around us. Burning off our own desires and demands may be just the deadly look that we must shake off. God provides a powerful cleansing agent for such a demanding task.

At Easter we celebrate the fact that God loves us so much that he sent Jesus, his only begotten Son to bring atonement for all who believe. To be cleansed in the precious blood of Christ, we must be willing to let the "dirt" fall away. It is only when we surrender completely to Christ that we will be ready to claim the new, even as the fields that are purged with fire to return to new life. Tried by fire is never pleasant but the impurities that are attached to us just as the dross in gold need a powerful action to remove what pollutes us at the deepest level. In Christ, we can celebrate that instead of burning our sins away we can simply give our past and its darkness to Jesus! There is no need to struggle through the debris so that we can grow in the Lord. All we are asked to do is to release it to Jesus!

What are you holding on to that could give rise to the question of is it dead or dormant? What are you willing to let go of so that God's glory may radiate in and through you for the world to see for God's glory? Give what is no longer useful so that God can use you to grow in the beauty of his love and life.
