Rooted or Root Bound

As trends change with the flow of life in society, some things seem to cause more trouble than good. Take an example of house plants. The plants we bring into our homes are properly fitted for the pot in which they are planted. With the passing of time however, after we care for them by watering, feeding and perhaps pruning back the withered stems, our plants get to a stage where they no longer flourish. The trouble lies at the roots. Filling the pot with roots may sound like a good idea but too many of a good thing is in fact harmful. Such it is for the changes that come to neighborhoods. While some change promotes good growth, others will stymie the growth.

Let me explain. In the forties and fifties, houses were built with an eye for community. Front porches were an integral part of the architecture. Large and spacious porches became a gathering point for neighbors as they would pass by on the walk in front. Conversation would follow and community would be experienced. We actually knew our neighbors. We had relationships with those around us to the point of sharing items when needed to be paid back later. We also took time to communicate what was important. Sharing of views and finding solutions to common dilemmas would strengthen the community feeling. In this culture, churches also could thrive because friends would come together to worship.

Today, we have become more isolated in our intent to live as closer family on a deck or patio built on to the back of our houses where our privacy is protected at any cost. Fences that build privacy and hedges that separate us from those around us make it more difficult to "speak with our neighbors". Simply put, we avoid the opportunities to get to know those living around us.

This "going it alone" frame of mind seems to be trickling its way into our church life. We no longer see the importance of gathering as the gathered people of God! We have all the gadgets that do what we formerly would turn to our neighbors for. Advice on cooking or caring for our homes is now a quick internet search and we are on our way with professional advice. Is it any wonder that church is no longer seen as the hub of life? Search engines on a computer replace the "old fashioned" way.

Having the benefits of technology would have us thinking that we should be able to grow as a church at an enhanced pace. Still we find that the gathering of a people has been lost. Perhaps the growth of our roots has changed from being an anchor to becoming an obstacle for growth, both in spiritual matters as well as in numbers. Maybe it is time to repot ourselves so that we can use the front of our houses more as a welcoming point. Sharing a bit of ourselves can make us vulnerable but the resulting benefit will be that in sharing we can actually become stronger.

When we open our lives to the scrutiny of our neighbors, we also open the paths of communication for seeking the lost while they may be found. What would a front deck or new front porch do for reaching you neighbors for Christ? We already are tying the Care Groups for those in the church and to those who are our guests. What if we could extend this to meeting the needs of the neighbors God has given us so we can reach some for Him?

I don't know about you, but I somewhat miss the idea of all arge porch on my home. A place welcoming to all my neighbors that allows me to extend my root rather than becoming root bound.


