## **Looking Ahead**

Is it possible that this is what the Psalm writer was hoping for? More importantly, could this mighty sound quiet the multitude of voices trying to deny and drown out the hope found in the true knowledge of God? The list of musical instruments may be the entire collection known to the writer. I also wonder how the balance might be achieved if all these were played together. Still, we can almost hear the excitement the writer likely was picturing in his mind when we read this song.

While I do not hold out a great deal of hope for this kind of massive choir occurring any time soon, I do think that it could begin with each of us. A single voice singing praise could actually be contagious. We may be exactly what someone is needing to hear even though we may not know the impact our song makes. God is able to use us in powerful ways when we are willing to praise Him in all things, at all times, and in all places.

Having said all that, you may be thinking that this sounds like a New Year's resolution. Still resolutions are personal promises and I hope to make this a large goal for life. The question is, "Who will join in this goal to let the praise to God fill the earth?" A corporate goal of all believers from all walks of life may seem unachievable to some. Yet is this any different from what Psalm 150 is seeking? With all the technology we have today to reach the multitudes often being used for far less important material, maybe it is time to think and dream bigger.

If we are willing to be one church determined to let the praise of God fill the air we may very well be surprised at the impact that we may have. God still is in control and can use the simplest praises to do even more that we ask or imagine. So what have you to lose? After all, we are called to praise Him anyway. Why not make it a goal to start the singing so that the world may join in and praise God as we should? It may simply make the year 2017 the best!

## Cheesy Potato Soup (Cooking for Two)

2 slices bacon 3/4 cup chopped onion 2 1/2 cups diced peeled russet potatoes (about 3 small) 1/4 cup chopped celery 2 cups Progresso™ chicken broth (from a 32-oz carton) 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/8 teaspoon pepper 1/4 cup all-purpose flour 3/4 cup half-and-half 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (from an 8 oz bag)

## Notes:

- a. One-half cup fat-free half-and-half or milk can be substituted for the half-and-half.
- b. Add 1/4 cup sliced carrot with the vegetables.

In 10-inch skillet, cook bacon over medium heat, turning occasionally, until browned and crispy. Remove from skillet, reserving fat in skillet. Drain bacon on paper towel, then refrigerate. In same skillet, cook onion in bacon fat over medium heat 4 to 5 minutes, stirring frequently, until tender.

Spray 3- to 3 1/2-quart slow cooker with cooking spray. In cooker, mix onion, potatoes, celery, broth, salt and pepper.

Cover; cook on Low heat setting 6 to 7 hours.

In small bowl, beat flour and half-and-half with wire whisk until well blended; stir into soup. Increase heat setting to High. Cover; cook about 20 minutes longer or until thickened. Stir in cheese until well melted. Crumble bacon; sprinkle over soup.


