Growing Right

The growing season has begun with the signs of corn and soy beans poking through the soil seen in the fields around us. The sure sign of spring and the expectation of summer is fully upon us. One thing we expect is that the plants that are sprouting through the soil will produce a crop in keeping with the promise of God, that plants will bear seeds in the own kind in season. But what if the plants only grew to seed bearing size and beauty without any fruit? Bean plants that produce nothing but green leaves would be a waste of space as well as corn without ears of corn.

Perhaps this is what Jesus was saying to us when in Mark 11 Jesus went to pick fruit from a fig tree that was beautifully leafed out but bore no fruit. Jesus was hungry and went to pick some fruit even though Mark informs us that it was not time for fruit on the tree. Jesus cursed the tree and in the same passage we find that the tree withered from the roots up. Trees that are supposed to bear fruit but do not are not what God intended and this can serve as a warning to us.

We are called to be bearing fruit for God in the lives that we live. While many of us do prosper in the life we live we seem to bear little fruit. If we are not reaching out, Jesus implied that we may not be praying for the opportunity to reach out to others. It also may be that we have the opportunities but we may not be praying for the words to speak. We are told in scripture that we will be given the words to speak when we need them but prayer is our way of assuring that we are ready.

How will we answer Jesus when asked about our willingness to bear fruit by planting the seeds of hope and salvation in the hearts and minds of those we come into contact with? When we plant the seed, the Holy Spirit can move mountains to bring about the peace that comes with finding the truth of Christ. But if we are only plants with beautiful leaves then we have no seed to plant. We must be fruitful in our lives so to bring others in to the blessings of our God.

So what does it take to grow right? Knowing the truth about what Jesus taught us is a good place to start. Knowing this will remind us as to why we believe in God and the plan he gave us that saves us from sin. Knowing Jesus comes from the knowledge of his message to us in the Bible and is reinforced in the teaching of a true church. Fellowship with others who are like minded in study will also strengthen our knowledge as iron sharpens iron.


