Why the Fuss over Easter?

It seems that Easter is best known for egg hunts, Easter bunnies, and of course being able to dress in wonderful new clothes. Well, maybe not the new clothes anymore, but we often lose sight of what Easter is all about. Perhaps it is because we live in the age of political correctness. After all, who really wants to hear of crowns of thorns, whippings, and a cross of all things? These really only work to bring us down when we would rather take a "selfie" to share or find out if we have more "likes" on Facebook as we show off our newest gadget.

The simple fact is that Easter is the most important day of the Christian calendar, yes even more than Christmas! While Christmas does mark the entry into the world of the Savior, Easter is the climax of the redemption plan God put into effect. What changed on the day we know as Easter is that death lost its grip of fear on all who believe in Jesus as the Savior. Easter is the assurance that the debt of sin, calling for death, is paid in full for all who claim Jesus as Lord and Savior. What we have been given is a new beginning!

Recall that when God created heaven and earth, we are told that that was the beginning of all things, in regard to our origin. The beginning was created perfect where God and the creation were able to walk together in harmony because it was "very good!" As we know, things did not stay that way. Sin changed everything. Death became the penalty for sin and even the ground was cursed, causing hardship and pain. Most tragic was that the relationship between God and humanity was destroyed. Sin and God could not co-exist. Atonement was needed to restore the relationship. The trouble arose in that nothing on earth, nor any simple human, could atone for the sins because every human was tainted by sin and no other "thing" could pay humanity's debt.

He died the death of the cursed, suspended between earth and heaven on a cross as a sign of being rejected by both. Even God the Father turned his face away, unable to look at the sin his only begotten Son was bearing for the crown of creation, humanity.

On Good Friday, the Son of God died! It is not the living who are buried, only the dead. Yet on the first day of the week, Sunday, a new beginning dawned on the earth. Death's hold was broken and Jesus, the Christ arose! Gloriously the presence of God came out of the tomb with many observances of him recorded for our benefit. The new beginning would find those who believe in Jesus as God and Savior would no longer need to fear death. Jesus opened the way to the presence of God to dwell among us again. Living up to that expectation is how we live out the assurance of the atonement in our lives.

We are saved through believing in faith that the grace of God reaches us but we live that salvation through the obedience of sharing the hope Easter gives us. That is what the fuss of Easter should be about. Not chocolate bunnies and eggs, but the hope of the new beginning we have in Christ Jesus, our Savior, through his atoning work assured because he rose and lives today.
