Technology is changing the way we live. I am sure you have noticed the factualness of that statement. If I miss talking with family and friends we can also wonder if we are "screening" the calls that come from God. We have many older songs that talk about the closeness of conversation with God. Spending time alone with God in prayer is even spoken of as being as vital as having our breath! But are we taking opportunity of this wonderful privilege of having a God who actually wants us to speak with him? Are we so wrapped up in our new technology that we would be happier if we could send a text, short and sweet, taking little time and just wait for a reply? While this may qualify as communication it leaves much room for relationship.

This shortfall can have serious consequences. We are told by our Savior that "My sheep know my voice..." but how can we know if we never hear this beautiful voice? Punching keys on a telephone is not the same! Maybe it is time we get back to the basics of our faith and spend a little time in the original wireless communication, prayer! God tells us he delights in hearing from his children. What parent or grandparent doesn't? So when was the last time you scheduled into you busy day time alone with God?

Technology will have its place in our world as we continually work to do more in less time and with less material. But we should never lose sight of what is worth keeping from the past. Prayer is what God the Son taught us. The lasting value of Christ's teaching should be not only explored but sought after and put into use. If we spend time talking with God and being alert to a response we will be better able to hear his voice and know who is speaking. Samuel needed to learn this after many tries on God's part. Are we missing out on something really big because we are screening the voice of God waiting for a text message?
