

What is scary though is that while we may have not been looking our religious rights have been in decline! In many of our schools in this country founded on religious freedom we deny our children the privilege of prayer! We have removed God's Law from our judicial system, even throwing out judges that refuse to remove the Ten Commandments from the courthouse. God's will for holy living has been made into a mockery through judgments from our court system. How many more times will we turn away without considering the consequences?

We may not be facing execution for declaring our faith but in many places in our world this is already happening. Can we live with our heads buried in the sand or is there something we should be doing? While our nation is currently in the heat of the political season, we as Christians must stand up for those who will hold to the truths of God. How we vote should be one area that defines who we are. While I am not endorsing any candidate, is this even a factor in whom we choose? I know we all become weary of the political process but failing to take a stand should not be our option. The Reformation was a difficult time in human history so let's do what we can to prevent a second time from being needed.

Stand strong in your faith! Let nothing keep you from following the will of God and know that no matter what may happen to the body, our faith can stand secure.
