The Cycle of Life



The changing of the seasons has brought to my mind the cycle of life for the leaves on the trees. This became apparent with the falling of the leaves that need to be cleaned up in my yard. The cycle is, of course, one that traces the life of the leaves beginning in the winter with the trees in a state of dormancy. The warmth of the spring brings out the buds that will become the life-giving leaves of summer. Still the fall comes around when the shorter days and cooler nights cause the leaves to die off and fall to the ground as the cycle begins again with the long nights and cold of winter. Life in a church, the experts say, follows the same cycle of life.

Churches do seem to have stages in life that follow the cyclical pattern of life. We find that there is a barren time where no church exists in a community. The people of the community gather to form an assembly of believers who organize into a life bringing church. Like minded, they welcome the opportunity to gather and praise God that invites growth both in number and spiritually. This is the combination of the spring and summer of the church.

The fall season likely sneaks up on the church as congregations become comfortable in the numbers and growth begins to slack off. It may not be obvious at first but after a time some members start to lose interest and fall away. At the same time the members themselves reach the fall of their life cycle and some begin to pass away. The decline is not rapid, but the numbers begin to decline and not be replaced with new members. This is often the start of the internal matters that soon take the attention of the members. Budgets become more difficult to reach and programs find it more difficult to find the volunteers needed to function properly.

The stagnate stage of winter is one where survival is the only thing on the mind of the congregation. We see examples of this stage in our Classis already. The sad fact of the matter is that the worship becomes more self-serving than God glorifying. The dormant stage of a church is one where hope begins to fade. Still, we must realize that the church is not about us but about God and being the body of Christ.

We are at a time when we must make the difficult decisions about our future. Since the time I came to this church, according to my count, we lost thirty-two members to glory. We have also lost some of our children to other churches when they moved from the area or simply for a more contemporary form of worship. This still leaves us with a deficit number to carry on with. This does not mean that the future holds no hope for us. It simply means that we must look to how we can become more inviting to the community around us. We live in a town where there are many unchurched people. Yet we must ask ourselves, what are we doing to attract this growing number of people?

We also must decide who we are going to reach out for. Are we looking to reach out for the traditional worshipper or are we looking to become a blended style of worshipping church? If contemporary is too far for us, what can we do to bring the lost into the fold of Christ. These are the questions we must be asking ourselves before we become the worshippers that gather for our own benefit and not to the glory of God. These are all questions to ask ourselves in the next year as we will need to define who we are so we can look for a new pastor in my impending retirement. We also will want to be as strong as we can be to draw a new pastor to our church. Having a plan will help us reach not only the strength to carry on but also to be what God wants us to be. Let's all work together to bring in the lost to God's honor and glory.
